Application for Tolls and Terms and Conditions of Service for the North Suffield Pipeline and Rockpoint Gas Storage Canada Ltd. (Rockpoint), Pine Cliff Energy Ltd. (Pine Cliff), and Torxen Energy Ltd. (Torxen) (the Complainants) objections and complaints regarding North Suffield Pipeline (the Complaint)

**Notice of Public Hearing and Hearing Timetable** 

On 21 February 2020, the Commission of the Canada Energy Regulator (Commission) issued a letter directing Campus to file an application for tolls and terms and conditions of service for the North Suffield Pipeline (Suffield North). The Commission further directed that Campus file information set out in the Canada Energy Regulator Filing Manual (referred to in past correspondence as the National Energy Board Filing Manual) - Chapter 5, Guide P parts P.1 to P.5. The Commission indicated that it would issue further process steps at a later date.

On 24 July 2020, the Commission issued a letter which provided information on how the Canada Energy Regulator (CER) is continuing its regulatory oversight during the COVID-19 pandemic. The CER has protocols in place for a variety of situations that could impact day-to-day operations. The CER is continuing its regulatory processes and execution of Commission decisions with specific operational changes being implemented.

On 8 April 2020, Campus filed an application for approval of tolls and terms and conditions of service for the Suffield Pipeline System. The application was for both Suffield North and the South Suffield Pipeline (Suffield South) although to-date no complaints have been received from Suffield South shippers.



On 15 April 2020, the Complainants filed a motion stating the Application filed by Campus did not include necessary information required to determine whether the proposed tolls and Terms and Conditions (T&Cs) will be just and reasonable. The Complainants requested, among other things, that the Commission direct Campus to file a revised application with all the information required by Guide P. The Commission established a comment process and received comments and reply comments from Campus and the Complainants on 22 and 24 April 2020, respectively.

On 5 June 2020, the Commission issued a letter directing Campus to refile its application to include the information required in Guide P (including information already filed on 8 April 2020) for Suffield North, disaggregated from Suffield South. If any disaggregated information or any of the other information required cannot be provided, Campus was to provide a detailed explanation of why that is the case.

On 26 June 2020, Campus refiled its application. The application now contains sufficient detail for the proceeding to commence.

### **Hearing Process**

The Commission has decided on a hearing process that adheres to federal and provincial Public Health Authorities' advice to maintain physical distancing. The Commission encourages all participants to remain up-to-date on the messages from the Public Health Authorities by checking these websites:

The proceeding will consider the attached List of Issues (Appendix I) and will consist of one round of Information Requests to the Applicant and Intervenors, and an opportunity for Participants to file Written Evidence and to provide Final Argument. The Commission would like the opportunity to ask parties questions and has included an oral component that will be conducted via Teleconference or Videoconference. Parties should be prepared to provide an oral summary of their position and reply as deemed necessary to points raised by other parties that could not have reasonably been responded to in writing. Details for the oral component will be issued at a later date. At this point, parties should reserve the date of **2 December 2020** for the oral component. Attached as Appendix II is a Hearing Timetable.

The Commission grants Intervenor status to Rockpoint, Pine Cliff, and Torxen.<sup>2</sup> The Commission is of the view that these parties have demonstrated their interests may be sufficiently impacted by the Commission's decision in the application and/or that their participation will assist the Commission. Any other shippers on Suffield North will also automatically be granted Intervenor status if they file a letter requesting Intervenor status by **26 August 2020**.

Should other interested persons wish to participate as an Intervenor, they must file a letter with the CER by **26 August 2020.** The letter should provide information demonstrating that their participation as an Intervenor is justified. The Commission will consider whether a person's interest may be sufficiently impacted by the Commission's decision, and/or their participation as an Intervenor will aid the Commission in this proceeding. In this

circumstance, should Intervenor status not be granted, the party may participate as a Commenter<sup>3</sup>. Persons only interested in participating as a Commenter need not apply ahead of time and may file a comment letter by the deadline set out in the Hearing timetable in Appendix II.

The Commission reminds parties that adjustments may be made to the schedule for the hearing as circumstances warrant. Parties may bring a notice of motion (motion) should they have concerns with the process or other matters. Motions should be made in accordance with section 35 of the National Energy Board Rules of Practice and Procedure, 1995. All motions must be filed on a timely basis, otherwise the Commission may decline to consider them.

The Commission directs Campus to immediately serve a copy of this letter, including the Notice of Public Hearing (Appendix III) as follows:

- 1. Distribute to all shippers on the North Suffield Pipeline;
- 2. Distribute to any other interested person, including shippers on the South Suffield Pipeline:
- 3. Distribute to the persons listed in Appendix IV to this letter; and
- 4. Publish the Notice of Public Hearing in the Calgary Herald and La Franco by 19 August 2020.

The Commission has identified but does not limit itself to the following issues for discussion in the proceeding:

- 1. Determination of the appropriate methodology for establishing just and reasonable tolls on the North Suffield Pipeline, including:
  - whether the tolls should be market-based or based on another methodology (e.g. cost of service); and
  - whether Campus should have discretion to revise the interruptible service toll.
- 2. The appropriateness of proposed terms and conditions of service for the North Suffield Pipeline, in particular the following changed terms and conditions about which the Complainants have raised concerns:
  - treatment of abandonment costs and collection method:
  - introduction of an Interruptible Preferred Service;
  - o process and treatment of costs for the testing of measuring equipment;
  - o pricing mechanisms related to customer gas account balances; and
  - specified billing date.

# Campus Energy Partners Suffield LP by its general partner Campus Energy Partners Operations Inc. North Suffield Pipeline Toll Application

Campus Energy Partners Suffield LP by its general partner Campus Energy Partners Operations Inc. (Campus) filed a revised application with the Commission of the Canada Energy Regulator (Commission) on 26 June 2020, requesting approval under sections 32, 34, 226, 229 and 232 of the *Canadian Energy Regulator Act* (CER Act) for an order approving tolls and terms and conditions for the North Suffield Pipeline System. The Commission has determined it will hold a public hearing to consider the Application.

Copies of the Application are available for viewing on the Canada Energy Regulator's (CER) website at <a href="www.cer-rec.gc.ca">www.cer-rec.gc.ca</a> (click on *View Regulatory Documents*, then *Active Hearings* and scroll down to the Application).

The Commission advises that Rockpoint Gas Storage Canada Ltd., Pine Cliff Energy Ltd., and Torxen Energy Ltd. are granted Intervenor status, should they wish to participate in this proceeding. Other shippers on the Suffield North Pipeline will also automatically be granted Intervenor status if they file a letter indicating they wish to participate as an Intervenor by **26 August 2020**.

Other members of the public may participate in this proceeding by filing a letter with the CER by **26 August 2020**. Members of the public will be entitled to participate by filing a letter of comment, at a minimum. Should a person other than Suffield North Pipeline shippers wish to participate as an Intervenor, that person must provide information to demonstrate that their interests may be sufficiently impacted by the Commission's decision, and/or that the person's participation as an Intervenor will aid the Commission.

The Commission will consider whether a person's interest may be sufficiently impacted by the Commission's decision, and/or their participation as an Intervenor will aid the Commission in the proceeding, based on the appropriateness of the tolls and terms and conditions of service for the Suffield North Pipeline, as applied for by Campus. If the Commission finds that such a person has not demonstrated their interest, their request for Intervenor status may be denied and they may participate as a Commenter.
