**Trans Mountain Pipeline ULC (Trans Mountain) – Application for the
Edmonton Terminal Tanks 20, 21 and 22 Deactivation Project (Project) under
section 44 of the *Canadian Energy Regulator Onshore Pipeline Regulations*
(OPR)**

The Commission of the Canada Energy Regulator (Commission) has considered Trans Mountain's application, dated 14 December 2020.

The Commission has issued Order MO-003-2021 (Order) pursuant to section 44 of the OPR, approving the Project. A copy of the Order and its Schedule A, which together outline the specifics of the Project as approved, is attached.

The Commission reminds Trans Mountain that the deactivated tanks remain subject to the CER's jurisdiction and direction, and shall continue to be monitored and maintained by Trans Mountain accordingly.

The Commission further reminds Trans Mountain that under section 45 of the OPR, no pipeline or part of one that has been deactivated for 12 months or more may be returned to service without leave of the Commission.

The Commission is of the view that overall, with the implementation of Trans Mountain's environmental protection procedures and mitigation and the conditions imposed by the Commission, the Project is not likely to cause significant adverse environmental effects.

The Commission directs Trans Mountain to serve a copy of this letter, the attached Order and its Schedule A on all interested parties.
