



## ORDER TG-004-2022

**IN THE MATTER OF** the *Canadian Energy Regulator Act* (**CER Act**); and

**IN THE MATTER OF** an application filed by Trans Québec & Maritimes Pipeline Inc. (**TQM**) with the Canada Energy Regulator (**CER**) pursuant to Part 3 of the CER Act filed under File OF-Tolls-Group1-T201-2022-01 01.

**BEFORE** the Commission of the CER (**Commission**) on 26 May 2022.

**WHEREAS** on 29 May 2014, the National Energy Board (**NEB**) issued its MH-001-2013 Decision, approving TQM's methodology for calculating Abandonment Surcharges;

**AND WHEREAS** on 18 April 2018, the NEB issued a Letter Decision, approving TQM's Abandonment Cost Estimate of \$115.5 million;

**AND WHEREAS** on 13 December 2021, the Commission issued Order TGI-002-2021, approving TQM's interim tolls and abandonment surcharges effective 1 January 2022;

**AND WHEREAS** on 3 February 2022, the Commission issued Order TG-001-2022, approving TQM's 2022-2023 Toll Settlement (**Settlement**);

**AND WHEREAS** on 30 March 2022, TQM filed an application for 2022 final tolls and abandonment surcharges (collectively, **2022 Final Tolls**) effective 1 January 2022 (**Application**);

**AND WHEREAS** the Commission finds the 2022 Final Tolls are just and reasonable and have been calculated in accordance with the Settlement and NEB decisions respecting abandonment costs and surcharges;

**AND WHEREAS** the Commission is not aware of any outstanding concerns with the Application from TQM's shippers or interested parties;

**IT IS ORDERED** pursuant to section 226 of the CER Act that:

1. Order TGI-002-2021, approving TQM's interim tolls and abandonment surcharges effective 1 January 2022, is revoked; and
2. TQM's 2022 Final Tolls, as contained in its Application dated 30 March 2022, are approved effective 1 January 2022.
